These will include how to log in on any computer or tablet. Click the Desktop or Tablet button then choose your class name or Free Play.



Practise phonic sounds to reveal an exciting picture.






Letter-join Word Banks are collections of word animations your class teacher has created for children to practise at school and at home.

How to open a classroom Word Bank



Log in to Letter-join

Use your school's Letter-join Pupil log-in and select your child's class name.



Choose 'Fun'

Select 'Word Bank' from the Letter-join 'Fun' menu.



Select a Word Bank

Use the pull-down menu to select a Word Bank.



Select a word to watch

Select a word either on-screen or from the pull-down menu at the top.



Watch and Try

Select 'Play' to see the word being written, then trace the word on an iPad or tablet by selecting 'Try'.



Use the Activities pull-down menu to select a Spelling List or Word Search.

Early Years

Colourful, touch-screen handwriting activities.



Under the 'Fun' tab you'll find lots of activities designed to offer touch-screen tracing practice for your children at home.

Magic Patterns can be used to trace Letter-join's pre-writing patterns and other shapes in a choice of fun palettes. Magic Words allows any word to be typed onto the screen and then traced over using a finger or a stylus for letter and word practice.

Write it Right! rewards neat handwriting with a picture gallery of children's handwritten words. Children can trace words that match pictures with fun sounds and animations encouraging them to play and practise letter shapes.



Many Letter-join activities have an accompanying printout sheets for real handwriting practice.



Letter-join Phonics

Children can hear the sounds and practise tracing them on iPads or tablets. The Phonics activities will be displayed in the font chosen by your child's class teacher.



Touch-screen tracing practice for pupils at home

Letter-join's pre-writing patterns are grouped into logical sets of similar shapes, and each pattern is animated, accompanied by exciting sounds.


Finer control can be gained by finger writing on tablets or with a pencil using the worksheets. Worksheets consist of lines of patterns for tracing using a pencil or crayon and a simple drawing which can be 'coloured-in' using the patterns of that group.



Pre-writing patterns cover all writing shapes.



Watch patterns, such as jellies, with fun sounds.



Practice tracing patterns on iPads or tablets.

Fun worksheets can be printed for all the pattern sets for handwriting practice using pencils and crayons.



Key Stage 1

At home, Letter-join is the perfect handwriting companion for KS1. Children have easy access to the same Letter-join resources as at school.

With gentle encouragement children will be aiming to produce neat handwriting with consistent spacing and letter sizes.


Practising handwriting exercises both on tablets and with pencils on worksheets can be fun, with real improvements achieved surprisingly quickly.



Letter Families

Key Stage 2






Pencil grip and sitting position


Holding a pencil correctly can help handwriting be more controlled and comfortable

Both right and left handed children should be encouraged to use the tripod grip which allows the pen/pencil to be held securely whilst allowing controlled movements of the pen/pencil nib.


- 1 Grip the pencil with your index finger and thumb with the nib pointing away.
- 2 With your free hand, spin the pencil from underneath.
- 3 Use your middle finger to support the underside of the pencil.





Positioning for left-handed children
